## Tournament/Festival Report - 2022 Season

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After a two-year hiatus due to Covid-19, the 31st Annual Peterborough Tournament and 9th Annual Festival for Girl's returned on the weekend of June 4/5 and the Boy's tournament/festival took place on the weekend of June 18/19. All in all, 101 teams participated over the two weekends. This was a drop of 31 teams from 2019.

Weather conditions were ideal on all four event days and the organizing committee received many complements from the visiting teams. Team registration was provided at both Eastgate and Beavermead fields, which was much appreciated by everyone. Thanks to the many club volunteers who helped with registration, set up nets and flags, acted as conveners at the different fields and assisted with trophy presentations.

Peterborough City teams won one division in the Boys tournament, namely U18, and were runners-up in two divisions in both the Boy's and the Girl's tournaments.

Although the quality of refereeing was very good and many compliments were received, with a large attrition rate there are not enough referees in the Peterborough Branch to cover all the games. This could well be a limiting factor for the size of the tournaments going forward. The Peterborough Referee Branch did an excellent job of covering the games with the assistance of some out-of-town officials who came to the rescue.
